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Funding Description

- <u>Primary prevention</u> programs and strategies are:
 - o directed at individuals not identified as in need of treatment, and
 - involve activities that shift focus 'upstream' to educate and support individuals and communities to delay the initiation of youth substance use and prevent the development of drug & alcohol misuse behaviors and substance use disorders.
- ARPA prevention funding focus area:
 - Implementation of ACES's related evidence-based programs/practices specifically reaching underserved populations (including young adults and older adults)

PPS Credentials

Provisional Prevention Specialist (PPS)

- If you are a new grantee/have not been funded consecutively in the past two years, you have 120 days (until October 31, 2024) to obtain a PPS credential.
- The PPS credential requires the completion of two short courses on ODP's free Learning Management System.
 - 1. Substance Abuse Prevention Ethics
 - 2. Fundamentals of Prevention
