Northwest Prevention Technology Transfer Center (PTTC) Monthly Webinars

The Northwest PTTC is funded by SAMHSA and exists to advance the Region 10 prevention workforce's ability to find, select, implement, and evaluate evidence-based and promising substance misuse prevention programs, policies, and practices. The Northwest PTTC offers 10 webinars annually (approx. 1 per month) that are typically approved for CPS CE credit, 1-hour each. Sign up for the NW-PTTC listsery to receive notifications.
